**ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT AND STATUS REPORT**

David Powell, a *pro se* participant in the instant proceeding, filed a motion with the Copyright Royalty Judges on July 11, 2016, styled “Pro Se Verified Motion for Elargement [sic] of Time Ex Parte To Reply Be Granted” (Motion). Mr. Powell appears to seek to extend the voluntary settlement period by 45 days.

On July 20, 2016¹ the Judges granted a joint motion by the most of the remaining participants in this proceeding to postpone the case schedule by 30 days to facilitate the negotiation of settlements. In light of that postponement, the Judges **DENY** the Motion **WITHOUT PREJUDICE**.
