Dear Chairman Garcia:

We are pleased to inform you that the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) and Broadcast Music, Inc. (BMI) have reached voluntary agreement on the distribution of cable compulsory license fees for the years 1979 through 1981, and of jukebox compulsory license fees for the years 1979 through 1982.

Pursuant to 17 U.S.C. §§111(d)(5)(A) and 116(c)(2), ASCAP and BMI have designated common agents to receive the combined royalties which shall be due our organizations, so as to preserve the confidentiality of our voluntary agreement.



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
