Dear Madam Chairman:

Enclosed with this letter are the Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Character Claimants. (Seven copies thereof, and of this letter, are being filed.)

The following schedule is our proposed allocation, in percentage terms, for the total cable royalty distribution for the year 1978:

(1) MPAA and program syndicators	45%
(2) Broadcasters	10%
(a) Canadian Broadcasting Corp.	*
(3) Sports	15%
(a) NCAA	**
(4) Music	15%
(5) PBS	12%
(6) NPR	*
(7) Cartoon Characters	3%
(8) Radio in general	*
(9) Miscellaneous	-0-
Total	100%

** included in Sports' percentage



We believe that the foregoing apportionment represents a fair allocation of the entire cable royalty fund among the claimants listed, taking into account all the proofs and arguments advanced during this proceeding and with due regard to the various criteria urged by the parties, including such factors as popularity, quality, time, fee generation, marketplace value, etc.

No single formula or approach can satisfactorily encompass all of the relevant considerations, and each of the surveys or studies (whether based on quantitative or qualitative factors) has obvious limitations. Our suggested allocation represents our best appraisal after weighing and reconciling all of the factors and criteria.
