Dear Mr. Berardinis:

This is in response to your claim submitted  
June 20, 1979.

In order to conform with the Copyright Statute,  
your claim must be submitted during the month of  
July of this year. This is a small inconvenience, I  
know, but could you please resubmit this claim next  
month. We will, nevertheless, keep your current letter  
on file.

I am enclosing copies of our regulations concern-  
ing cable royalty claims. Claims for the first half  
of 1978 must have been filed in July 1978 and had to  
include:

(a) The full legal name of the person or  
entity claiming compulsory license fees.

(b) The full address, including a specific  
number and street name or rural route, of the  
place of business of the person or entity.

(c) A general statement of the nature of the  
copyrighted works, whose secondary transmission  
provides the basis of the claim.

(d) Identification of at least one secondary transmission establishing a basis for the claim.

Unfortunately, our records do not indicate that you have filed a claim for the first half of 1978, and your current claim will not serve such a purpose.

After the first of August of this year, the Tribunal may consider whether claims which have been filed late will still be respected; but if not, yours, for the first half of 1978, will not be valid.
